Blest Be the Tie that Binds

John Fawcett (1739-1817), a dissenting Baptist clergyman in England, gave us one of the most beloved farewell hymns of all time. He was orphaned at 12, and "bound out" to a tailor in Bradford where he worked long hours. He learned to read and eventually mastered *Pilgrim's Progress*, the devotional classic by John Bunyan. He was converted under the powerful preaching of George Whitefield while the evangelist delivered a message to 20,000 people in an open field. It is said that upon telling Whitefield he wanted to preach, the evangelist gave Fawcett his blessing.

John and Mary Fawcett went to live at Wainsgate in 1765 following his ordination. The people there were poor farmers and shepherds, unable to read or write. He built his congregation by going house to house. As his family and expenses grew, they entertained and accepted another call. However, the people became so despondent and tearful as they prepared to leave, they changed their minds and remained there for 54 years. Fawcett developed a school for the area children by adding on to his home. He was known as an educator and scholar, as well as a fine preacher. This hymn may not have been written at this time but its language connects well with congregations, identifying with the struggles of life and our unity in Christ.

In 1811 Fawcett published his *Devotional Commentary on the Holy Scriptures* and was also honored with a Doctor of Divinity degree from Brown University, Providence, R.I.
