<sup>1</sup> Praise is due to you,  
O God, in Zion;

**and to you shall vows be performed,**

<sup>2</sup> To you who hear prayer!

all flesh shall come because of their sins.

**<sup>3</sup> When our transgressions prevail over us,  
you forgive them.**

<sup>4</sup> Blessed are those whom you choose and bring near  
to dwell in your courts!

**We shall be satisfied with the goodness of your house,  
your holy temple!**

<sup>5</sup> By dread deeds you answer us with deliverance,  
O God of our salvation;

**who is the hope of all the ends of the earth,  
and of the farthest seas;**

**<sup>6</sup> who by your strength established the mountains,  
being girded with might;**

<sup>7</sup> who stills the roaring of the seas,  
the roaring of their waves,  
the tumult of the peoples;

<sup>8</sup> so that those who dwell at earth's farthest bounds  
are afraid at your signs;

**you make the morning and  
the evening resound for joy.**

<sup>9</sup> You visit the earth and water it,  
you greatly enrich it;

**the river of God is full of water;**

**you provide its grain,**

**for so you have prepared it.**

<sup>10</sup> You water its furrows abundantly,  
settling its ridges,  
softening it with showers,  
and blessing its growth.

<sup>11</sup> **You crown the year with your bounty;  
the tracks of your chariot drip with fatness.**

<sup>12</sup> The pastures of the wilderness drip,  
the hills gird themselves with joy,

<sup>13</sup> **the meadows clothe themselves with flocks,  
the valleys deck themselves with grain,  
they shout and sing together for joy.**

### St Luke 18: 9-14

<sup>9</sup> Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: <sup>10</sup> "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. <sup>11</sup> The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. <sup>12</sup> I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' <sup>13</sup> And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise *his* eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' <sup>14</sup> I tell you, this man went down to his house justified *rather* than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."
